

## Education Maintenance Allowance (EMA) Other dependant evidence

If your household income is between **£20,818** and **£23,077** you need to send evidence that there's another dependant living in your household. Use the information below to find out what original evidence you need to send in support of your application.

You must send original evidence, if you send photocopies this will cause delays.  
All originals will be returned to you as soon as possible.

If your household income is **£23,078** or more you won't be able to get EMA.

Other dependant children living with me aged between 16, 17, 18, 19 or 20 and in full-time further education or training	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• your household's most recent Child Benefit statement; <b>or</b></li><li>• your household's most recent Tax Credit Award Notification that lists each young person; <b>or</b></li><li>• the child's original birth certificate <b>and</b> a confirmation of enrolment or award from a Further Education Institution as proof that the child has been accepted onto a course</li></ul>
