You might be able to get funding if you failed to complete your previous course because of a compelling personal reason. Examples of compelling personal reasons are illness or bereavement, but circumstances can be reviewed on a case by case basis. You'll need to provide evidence of this.

The deadline for a one year course is nine months after the first day of your academic year.

It's important you read the following 6 things before applying for Postgraduate Master's Finance.

- 1 You can apply for a loan of up to £19,635. Your loan will be split evenly over the length of your course and you'll get 3 payments for each academic year. This will be paid directly into your bank account.**
- 2 You'll be charged interest on your loan from the day you get your first payment. This will continue until you've fully repaid your loan or your loan is cancelled after 30 years — whichever comes first.**
- 3 The interest rate is made up of the Retail Price Index (RPI) plus an additional 3%. In the future this could go up or down.**
- 4 You'll have to repay your loan, but only when you've left university and your income is over £21,000 a year.**
- 5 You'll repay 6% of your income over £21,000 towards your postgraduate loan.**

You'll repay this amount in addition to any repayments you're making towards any undergraduate student loans you already have.
